

Hand Starting vs. Starters

I've mentioned before that using a starter on many old engines can cause internal damage. I received a follow-up question from Jerry Burke, in Texas, asking for details. My answer might help save an old engine.

The front ball bearing on a modern engine limits the crankshaft from being pushed back more than a couple thousandths of an inch or so when a starter is applied. Most older plain bearing. engines are crankshaft's fit is often loose enough that the crankshaft can be pushed back and actually grind against the backplate under the

starter's application. That grinding destroy an engine. Some of those engines might have a snug enough drive washer to the crankshaft fit so that this doesn't happen.

Even so, the drive washer can grind into the front of the aluminum case an produce galling and particles that can migrate into other parts of the engine. A thin, smooth, stainless-steel shim behind the drive washer can reduce or eliminate that galling, but finding a shim of a suitable size is difficult if the engine doesn't already have one.
