Orchard Point update

John Thompson reports - This is a status update on the situation with parking permits at Orchard Point. We are required to have Lane County parking permits if we plan to park our vehicles when flying at the site, which we will begin doing after the water inundates the ranch.

The \$10 special permit price for the Prop Spinners is no longer available. There is a new parks administrator who has ended the discount. However, anyone over age 62 can get the pass for \$20. As always, it is good for a year at any county park. The full rate is \$40.

We do not charge the weekly \$5 flying fee at Orchard Point, so that helps offset the cost of the permits for regular fliers.

Also, just fyi, we are entering the last year of our second three-year permit at Orchard. I have started the process of applying for a renewal for the next three years.

To get your parking permit, telephone the county at 541-682-2000. They will charge your credit card and mail you the permit. If they do not have your "senior" status on file, you may have to go to the parks office and show ID to get your senior discount.

You can also purchase the parking permits at Lane County Bi-Mart stores; because we don't get the \$10 special rate any more, there's no need to go to the parks department. Be sure to ask for the senior rate of \$20.

I also checked Orchard Point. The EPS lock is still there and correctly in the chain. Someone has lubed it up and it is easy to open at the old combination.
