## Let's Go to a Contest!

While that's a good building time for most of us, it is a cool weather flying opportunity for those in the Desert Southwest. The next traditional contest is the Southwest Regionals in Tucson, Arizona the weekend of 3-4 February 2024. Don't worry, that's not a conflict with the NFL playoffs or the Super Bowl! (See flyer at the end of this newsletter.)

The NCS Spring Postal Contest will run through the entire month of May this year and extend through the first weekend in June (1 May through 2 June 2024)

NATS: The Navy Carrier National Championship will be 5-8 August 2024. Processing will be on Monday evening (5 August) with Profile on Tuesday (6 August), Class I and Class II on Wednesday (7 August), and unofficial events on Thursday (8 August). That's the week immediately preceding the FAI CL World Championships in Muncie. There is also a couple of days of FAI event competitions leading up to the CL Worlds, and NATS CL Week will be shared with a large helicopter "Jamboree" on site. With all the competing activities, it's not too early to make hotel reservations in Muncie!

# Rules Report

The CL Navy Carrier Contest Board had two proposals to consider this year. Both were defeated in the Final Ballot last September. The rules will remain unchanged for the 2024-2025 contest season.

I was at the Reno Air Races, and got to see a rather uncommon aircraft, the Fairey Firefly. Of course, this made me think of Bob Reynolds' matched set of Fireflies from the late '70s. It may be of interest to the members.



# Arresting Line Weights -- Alternative to Sandbags Bob Paul, Elyria, Ohio

Getting sandbags sewn has always been a problem. I even bought a sewing machine to learn how to sew so I wouldn't have to bother anyone else. Fortunately, I think I've come up with a better and longer lasting solution. Window weights from homes being remodeled or demolished. The weights I have are 5, 6, 7, & 8 lbs., and the weights are usually cast into them. The gold painted one has a 5 close to the rope hole, most of the others in the pile are cast in the middle. That whole pile came from one old house, and I think there are 54 in that pile, all cast iron. I paid \$20 for the whole pile, delivered. If you go on eBay you'll see some hefty prices + huge shipping prices. If you go to anyone locally and tell them what you want them for, it will probably be pretty reasonable. There will usually be 4 weights per window, example would be 2-5 lb. weights for bottom windows, 2-6 lb. weights for top windows. I have a 14" cutoff saw, so I can figure how much to cutoff of the heavier weights if necessary. The important thing is to have equal weights on the ends of each line. These may slide through grass easier than the bags. I think it's important to mark on them as I did on the gold painted weight for future carrier fliers. They could also be clear shrink wrapped with the same clear shrink wrap used on Lipo batteries to prolong their appearance.
