NEW FLYING SITE AT CHEHALIS AIRPORT

Thanks to the efforts of our new C/L show team, the "Skyraiders Flying Circus," we have a new flying site at the Chehalis-Centralia Airport.

The team put on such a good show at the airport's Air Fair 2007 celebration on July 27-28 that the airport board not only invited us back for next year but also granted permission to use the site for the rest of the year.

Team members were: Walt Russell, Bill Darkow, Doug Oertli, Ron Cannan, Ben Jones & wife, Gary DuBois & wife as well as Leo Mehl and Jim Cameron from the NW Fireballs.

Site is a concrete-surfaced 150-ft. diameter painted circle on the apron of an abandoned runway. There's also room for a grass circle and plenty of parking and pit area. Site is fenced with access controlled through an electronic-coded gate.

CONDITIONS OF USE

- 1. Control Line Model Airplanes Only.
- 2. NW Skyraiders Members & Guests Only.
- 3. All Flyers & Pit Crew members must have valid AMA licenses.
- 4. Please notify Bill Darkow (360) 273-0320, Walt Russell (253) 833-3988 or Doug Oertli (360) 330-5774 at least 24 hours

before you plan to fly at the site so one of them can open the gate for you.

- 5. Parking preferred on concrete-surfaced area, but grass area may be used if necessary.
- 6. No parking close to hangar near the flying site.
- 7. Muffled engines preferred.
- 8. All appropriate safety requirements listed by the AMA, such as wrist thongs, must be followed.
- 9. AMA Flying Site Owner's Insurance must be in force.
- 10. Remember that we are their guests using their property and act accordingly.

DRIVING DIRECTIONS

- 1. Take Exit 79 (Chamber Way) from I-5.
- 2. Turn RIGHT at first light. Go approx. 1 block.
- 3. Turn LEFT at 2nd light onto NW Louisiana Ave.
- 4. Follow that to 1st major intersection.
- 5. Turn RIGHT onto NW Airport Way.
- 6. Follow that to Airport Entrance sign.
- 7. Turn RIGHT onto airport entrance road.
- 8. Follow that approx. 1/4mi. to electronic gate.


