
Salem Fun Fly. The Fireballs were well represented at the recent Salem Fun Fly. Six members attended. Weather was good and all attending reported having a great time.

Friday, April 20

RECORD RATIO SPEED: 9:00am - 11:00am, resumes at end of Northwest Clown Racing until done, all speed classes. At the conclusion of the speed event, the paved circle will be made available for Stunt practice. Also on Friday, the grassy areas adjacent to the paved circle will be open all day for practice flying of all types.

NORTHWEST CLOWN RACING: 11:00am until completed (no later than 2:30pm, earlier if fewer entries)

Saturday, April 21

HIGH PERFORMANCE 1/2A COMBAT: 10:00am, to be flown over grass circle #3, double-elimination. AMA "Kill" rules in effect.

NORTHWEST PROFILE STUNT: 9:00am - Noon, to be flown over the paved circle.

CLASSIC-NOSTALGIA STUNT: 1:00pm - until completed, to be flown over the paved circle.

AMA SANCTIONED EVENT: Current AMA membership is required of all entrants. Flyers can join or renew their membership at the event. Stunt BOM appearance points will be calculated: if you build the plane, you will receive up to 20 appearance points, if you finished an ARC, up to 10 appearance points, and if the plane was an ARF or built or finished by others, zero appearance points.

ENTRY FEE: \$20 for the first event and \$5 for each additional event, up to a maximum of \$30 for the entire contest.

WHAT HAVE YOU BEEN UP TO THIS WINTER??

A visit to Don Curry's workshop:

Although Don's planes hang in various locations throughout the home attached to his two-car garage, it is the garage that holds his hobby shop (only one side, as his '31 Ford is on the other). The door remains open most of the summer and many of the neighbors stop and chat while he is working. He has donated many rubber-powered kits to the neighborhood children to build, and some of their parents have stopped by to ask for model-building directions (so he isn't sure how many of the kids have worked on them). In the winter, however, Don works on his own.

In the stand on the bench is a scale model of an Aerocoupe. For control-line with throttle-control, it will have a wing span of about 63" and will be powered by an OS 46. He needs to do

more research for the particular full-scale plane he wants to model and is searching for the present owner to get some different pictures to help define the color scheme.





The other winter project is a framed and almost-ready-to-cover Ares from an Ambroid kit. He built one for Geoffrey and is building this one for himself. The radio-control sail boat on the bench, made of balsa wood from some drawings that his friend Jim Weaver made, is the first boat that he has attempted to build. It is finished but has not been in the water yet

This 1/2A Norvel-powered Magician, scaled down to a 24" wingspan, was on display at the February club meeting and was also featured on the home page of Flying Lines. It flies on 42' Spectra lines.



Part of the credit for all this work possibly goes to the tools against the wall: scroll saw, belt sander, drill press, band saw and bench grinder (also, not shown, a table saw, which gets quite a bit of use). Hanging on the equipment wall are a P-40, Clown, Magician Baby, Clown (electric) and Acromaster.

The yellow plane hanging from the ceiling is a built-from-plans model of a Super Sportster kit. It is radio controlled, with a 78" wing span and powered with an OS 1.2 cu. inch. The other is an Aronca Model K.


