editor's note: The following is from an email received from A.M.A. on August 7th. This was sent to all A.M.A. leader members to be shared with others, which I am doing here. Please note the third paragraph!

Below is the latest from Tyler Dobbs from AMA Government Affairs about the most recent FAA/AMA meeting.

- The 2018 FAA Reauthorization Act changed the operating requirements for recreational UAS users. One of the new provisions requires that fixed flying sites in controlled airspace have a letter of agreement (LOA) with the local air traffic control facility. To date, AMA clubs have submitted information for 238 fixed flying site locations in controlled airspace. Of the aforementioned 238 sites, only eight clubs have finalized their LOAs. We expect all of our clubs to be contacted soon to begin to finalize an LOA for their club's flying site location.
- AMA and the FAA are still discussing options regarding a permanent blanket waiver to operate above 400 feet in Class G airspace. Until this waiver is finalized, continue to operate within AMA safety programming. AMA HQ will update our members when more information is available.
- AMA and the FAA have been in discussions regarding exempting Control Line operations. Although the two organizations haven't come to an agreement yet, we have agreed that letters of agreement are not needed for clubs/sites that only flying Control Line aircraft.

Turn left onto Fern Ridge Road which is BEFORE the double yellow flashing lights (by Gene's Meat Market)





It was nice to hear that the Skyraiders were able to use this nice facility again for this meet and their upcoming September contest as well.

John Thompson won the lightly entered Old Time Stunt event with his Barnstormer. In Classic Stunt, Jerry Eichten took top honors with his new Oriental. In the Profile Class, WOLF members did a sweep, with Fred Underwood flying his electric powered Similar 2, followed by Jerry and John.

On Saturday night contestants were treated to a bbq dinner at the contest director Mike Haverly's home.

On Sunday the Precision Aerobatics classes were flown, known by some as "real stunt". Mike Denlis placed third in the Advanced class. John flew in Expert but the usual NW Stunt gurus took the top places.

It seems like some years we put on an event in June, and some years we don't. This year we did and it was a good success.

The contest was billed as the 2019 Salem Summer Tune-Up. The dates were June 28, 29, & 30. Adding Carrier competition was a first for our club. Carrier event director Craig Bartlett worked real hard on getting the deck in good shape and setup right. The Carrier turnout was a little light, but those participating had a great time.

There is some crossover interest in the Speed and Racing events, so it makes sense to have both when possible. As usual, NW B Proto was the most popular Speed event, and there was plenty of interest in the NW Sport Race event.

Eleven control-line pilots participated in this traditional event put on by the Western Oregon Control Line Flyers. The attendance was slightly down from the usual, but there was plenty of flying. The action included a variety of planes, with Combat, Stunt, Speed, and plenty of sport types including many 1/2 A ships. Dave Shrum had a small fleet of spark ignition birds that he put up.

A new feature that was tried this year was to block off the cul-de-sac paved area to make an additional small flying circle. This area accommodated up to 35-foot lines and worked out great, especially since the pavement there is so smooth. Before the event, the area was cleaned off with a leaf blower. Gene Pape commented that this area was just perfect for the little planes.

The weather was great for the day; temperatures in the eighties and a light breeze made it all very pleasant.

Doug Powers of Portland, Ore., got the winning hand and went home with \$55. As per event tradition, second- and thirdbest hands got merchandise awards.
