#### Bladder Grabber 2018

They all entered both the high performance 1/2 A event, and Fast which utilizes .36 size engines. Entry was up slightly this year to 20 in each event. When all the streamers, broken balsa, and bits of foam wing had finally cleared the air, Gene had taken first place in 1/2 A, and Mike grabbed 2nd in Fast. This was a very enjoyable contest that was run very smooth and efficiently. Hey, and the prizes weren't too bad either!


